We've enjoyed watching our monarch caterpillars turn into their chrysalises...and are now anticipating their metamorphosis into butterflies! When they do


hatch out, we look forward to letting them "go, go, go to Mexico"!



### Common Core Standards in ELA

This is the first of a year-long series to give you factual information on the Common Core Standards. I'll try to show the standard and explain its' purpose, but also try to keep the information objective, so that you can form your own opinion.


For ELA, I will concentrate on the standards for juniors and seniors, because these are the standards all students work towards from pre-kindergarten through graduation. These are the standards meant to prepare students for work and/or college. In ELA, there are three sets of standards. The standards are grouped in reading literature (RL), reading informational text (RI), and writing (W).

Standard RL11-12.1 is "cite strong and thorough textual evidence to support analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text, including determining where the text leaves matters uncertain." The Common Core app goes on to say that the standards is meant to help students become college and career ready, in that they must be able to think about different types of literature, from current popular pieces, to classics. Students must be able to explain their reasoning through good writing and by using parts of the literature as examples.

Standard RI.11-12.1 is similar, but students must gather the same understanding from informational text, in that they must be able to read the text, understand its' main meaning, and find details to help explain their understanding. In many cases, teachers will have students read a piece of literature, and then read a corresponding information text that deals with some of the same topics as the literary piece, so that students can draw inferences and comparisons to both.

Standard W.11-12.1 is "write arguments to support claims in an analysis of substantive topics of texts, using valid reasoning and relevant and sufficient evidence." With this standard, students are expected to be able to do research with literature or informational text, and write a paper making a claim or statement, and then draw support from the text for their argument. They need to be able to prove their point in a clear and precise manner, which should not only help students in college, but also in their careers as they propose changes or improvements in their place of work. This could also help them when working to make a change in their community or country.


### **OLSAT-8 TESTS**


### From the School Nurse...


